WHY IS IT IMPORTANT?

We believe that it's important for children to understand where in the world they live and how this relates to other places. This learning starts in Year 1 with exploring their immediate locality. The children become familiar with the area surrounding our school and our place within the United Kingdom.

This topic builds on the children's existing knowledge about places familiar to them. It also offers lots of opportunities for building their vocabulary about everyday places.

Year 2: Rainforests

WHY IS IT IMPORTANT?

Learning about rainforests ignites children's curiosity about the world. We want our children to become geographers who ask questions about the world they live in and seek out information. This topic provides plenty of opportunities for developing this. We also believe that it is essential for our children to learn about the issues facing our planet. It's important that they understand the concept of sustainable development. This topic allows us to explore the effect of humans on the rainforest.

This topic allows the children to build on the skills they learned in Year 1 but apply them in a new and less familiar context.
