Lots of us thought it looked like a smiley face.



Here is the scientific explanation.

A circumzenithal arc is a type of Halo. They are formed when sunlight refracts through horizontal ice crystals at such an angle that the light enters the crystal through its flat top face and exits through a side prism face causing the distinctive upside-down rainbow effect. They are commonly associated with Cirrus clouds where ice crystals readily form.

On Friday 15th November, the Killigrew A team faced a Mandeville team in a match which Killigrew dominated. After a loose ball fell around the halfway line, defender Michael took an amazing touch, gliding past a Mandeville midfielder and hammered the ball into the back of the net from distance. This ignited Killigrew's hunger to get a few more and they flooded in quickly. Kayden's bullet of a strike flew past the keeper and sparked wild celebrations from Killigrew to extend their lead. After a great sequence of attacks, Finn's rocket was halted by a world-class save and finished off by Thomas. The halftime whistle blew to put an end to an incredible first half.
