Home School Agreement & Parent Contract

At Killigrew, we work in partnership with parents and carers to create a safe, respectful and inclusive environment for pupils, staff and parents/carers. As a school team we model appropriate, respectful, polite and kind behaviour to all members of the school community.

To help us work together with parents, we have reviewed our Home School Agreement and Parent Contract. This now details our aims and values and sets out guidelines for kind, respectful and appropriate behaviour. In this agreement we use the term 'parents/carers' to refer to anyone with parental responsibility for a pupil and/or anyone caring for a child (such as grandparents or childminders who are in contact with school staff).

A condition of enrolment in Killigrew Primary and Nursery School is that all parents/carers read the Home School Agreement and Parent Contract and follow the link on the document to confirm that they agree to abide by the terms of the agreement and understand the implications of breaching this contract. Please therefore complete the agreement form by 18th October 2024.
