#### Measles

We have received the following information from the Hertfordshire Community NHS Trust.

We are currently seeing outbreaks of measles across England. We know that more than 3.4 million children under the age of 16 years are not fully vaccinated against measles and are at risk of catching this serious and completely preventable disease. For every 1000 children who catch measles, between 1-2 will die. This is a highly infectious disease.

Pregnant women are at higher risk of developing serious complications from measles and should speak to their GP as soon as possible if they have been exposed to measles.

Parents can check their child has had both MMR vaccinations with their GP, on the NHS app or in their child's red book. Catch up vaccines are available via a GP or the School Aged Immunisation Service (details below). GPs, the immunisation service and the school nursing team are happy to discuss the MMR vaccine with any parents who have questions or concerns
