Match report 3.2.2025

On Monday 3rd February, the Killigrew A team faced Prae Wood in a thrilling clash. Killigrew previously beat Prae Wood in a nail-biting 1-0 victory. The A team, now at home, started the game with instant pressure and a close attempt, which was followed with a corner. Killigrew's effort paid off when winger Jacob volleyed in a fallen cross. which sparked celebrations. After a few displays of excellent defending and playmaking by Killigrew's defenders Lucas and Leon, the ball was back in the Prae Wood half, and a second shot flew past the opposing keeper's stretched arms and then another. Killigrew was now three goals ahead. Kayden, Killigrew's midfielder, weaved through the Prae Wood defence and struck a rocket into the net. The first half was halted by the referee's whistle. Halftime score: Killigrew 4-0 Prae Wood.

The second half

Killigrew, with a large advantage, made substitutions to start the second half. However, a determined Prae Wood defence came back strong to make scoring attempts difficult. Samuel, the current striker, had a great string of chances, but his shots were not entering the opposition's net. Thomas made some creative corner kicks, but the ball could not pass the goaltending by the Prae Wood goalie. Michael, in midfield, created chances for the play to flow up to Theeran, who moved from defence into an attacking position. At the other end of the pitch, goalkeeper Clayton stopped every attempt that came his way, leaping across the goal to put an end to any attacks. Killigrew's substitutes entered the game. Finn, who had scored two goals in the first half, was gunning for his hat trick. A few minutes after the substitutes were made, a poor clearance fell to Finn's feet. His shot rocketed into the corner. Killigrew pounced from the restart, and another shot was fired at the goal, the net bulging once more. Killigrew's final attack was stopped by the shrill whistle.
