



How can I help at home?

Early Years

Talk with your child about different family celebrations and what happens at them. Share special books with your child and encourage them to respond to the story.

Year 1

Talk with your child about ways we show we are thankful and how people who follow a religion might show their gratitude. Discuss how babies are welcomed into the world.

Year 3

Talk about the commitment that we have to show in our own lives; for example, to a sports club or Scouting group. Ask your child to discuss what they've learnt about showing commitment to a faith.
